Bay Area Career Expo Update: Over 1,500 Job Seekers Register

Still time to complete pre-screening for chance to meet Wednesday with over 100 employers

MADISON – With less than two days remaining before the Bay Area Career Expo in Green Bay, Department of Workforce Development (DWD) Secretary Reggie Newson today announced over 1,500 job seekers have pre-registered for the opportunity to connect with over 100 employers recruiting for 1,300 openings at the event.

“We are pleased with the response from job seekers, having issued admission tickets to over 1,500 job seekers for this major recruitment event,” Secretary Newson said. “There’s still time for other job seekers to register, complete their resumes, and get everything in order as part of quick and easy pre-screening process. It’s our way of expediting the recruiting process for both job seekers and employers.”

In urging job seekers to register now, Secretary Newson noted that available positions pay as much as \$35 an hour. The Bay Area Career Expo runs Wednesday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., at Shopko Hall. Secretary Newson stressed the importance of job seekers acting now to get the necessary admission ticket before the expo doors open on Wednesday. Information about the pre-registration process is available on www.JobCenterofWisconsin.com. Registration takes three easy steps:

1. Visit <https://jobcenterofwisconsin.com/>, and either register with the DWD online employment site or, if already registered, update information as necessary;
2. Use the site’s “Job Seeker Tools” to create or update a resume, take a self assessment survey, save and print copies of both for the final step;
3. Complete a one-on-one session with an employment specialist, who will review the resume and assessment results and cover potential steps in the job application process before issuing an admission ticket.
