WHY ACP?- WI Data AVGs

HS Graduation (2010-14) 87.6%

2014 NOT College Ready (ACT)

English- 24.4%

Reading- 48.4%

Math- 44.8%

2014 College Enrollment

2 year- 33%

4 year- 65%

30% (in 3 years)


AVG Cost Per Degree = \$42,745



KEY ELEMENT #1- *Relationships!*


- Trusted and respected **adult mentors/advisors**







ACP District Plan (PI 26)

The plan shall address:

- **Local, regional, and state labor market needs**
- **Education and training requirements for occupations that will fill labor market needs**
- Process to engage parents regarding ACP services provided and opportunities to participate
- **Strategy to engage business, postsecondary education, and workforce development**
- Description of Career and Technical Education (CTE) programming available, staff professional development for ACP delivery, and how school district will meet education for employment program requirements



ACP Services (PI 26)

The services shall provide information and opportunities that lead to:

- **Career Awareness** in elementary
- **Career Exploration** in middle and high school
- Career Planning and Preparation in high school that includes
 - **Career Research**
 - School supervised **work-based learning experiences**
 - **Career decision making**
 - Application of academic skills, technologies, economics
 - **Entrepreneurship**
 - **Personal financial literacy**
 - **CTE opportunities**
 - **Labor market information**
 - **Employability skills**



ACP Software

- Electronic Tool required in schools in Fall 2017
 - Career Cruising chosen by WI; **Link to DWD Tools**
 - Districts can choose others (CC is Optional)
 - Accounts creation now
 - Training begins in late summer 2016
 - Contract signing in final stages
- Connections to **Business-Ed Portal** like *Inspire* or *YourFuture* (Fox Cities)

Legislative Actions

AB 772/SB 596

- Passed in Assembly 2/12/16; Passed in Senate 2/9/16
- Consolidation of some DWD funding- Flexibility to move funds
- **CTE incentive grants.**

DWD MAY provide grants to school districts for the development of programs that are designed to mitigate workforce shortages in industries and occupations that are experiencing a workforce shortage, ***as determined by DWD***, and to assist pupils in graduating with industry-recognized certifications in those industries and occupations.



Legislative Actions

SB 642/AB 734

- Passes 2/16/2016 in Assembly
- Career and Workforce Education PILOT program in a CESA
- Hire a Career and Workforce Education Coordinator and establish a career and workforce education pilot program.
- DPI to work with DWD the CESA
- Up to \$125,000 of eligible expenses in each of the 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years.
- Create an Application, Scoring Rubric, Reporting Tool



Legislative Actions

Act 55 Budget

- CTE Licensing to teach technology education
- Technology Education includes architecture and construction, biotechnology, broad-based technology education, communication and information technology, electronics, engineering, environmental technologies, manufacturing, power and energy, and transportation
- 100 Point rubric
